Nando's Office (Amit Aurora and Rahul Bansal, Principal Architect, DCA)

The client presented a brief that demanded a dynamic, playful and vibrant space for their young team. The intent was to deliver efficient interior spaces that would accurately mirror the brand's core values, ethos, and strategic objectives. The spatial



planning strategy exploits the site shape to funnel people inside, from an open and wider reception to the more private meeting rooms inside. Dividing the longitudinal corridor into a series of interactive spaces, the monotony is broken by arranging the working cabins and open areas in a manner that the corridor always seemed interesting. Natural daylight is maximised from the north and the south through the use of glass, while glare is minimised. The use of glass doors also facilitates optimal daylight ingress, creating a shift from typical, artificially-lit corridors. The cabins are aligned with windows on the outer wall that provide stupendous views of the urban surroundings. A very earthy and natural palette of materials and colours have been used to design this office- mango wood furniture together with metal chairs add to the eclectic mix of elements.

With an aim to create a vibrant and quirky work space for young professionals, the intent was to enable transparency and encourage collaboration. With area and budgetary constraints, the challenge lied in strategising a "Value-Engineered" scheme that would optimise function in relation to cost: delivering the best design within minimal financial investment, while ensuring comprehensive functionality. The architects focused on creating a minimal backdrop through the use of natural finishes - brick, concrete, and wood-while adding pops of vibrant colours through the use of modern artwork and quirky furniture. This helps to create an informal atmosphere within the workspace, encouraging transparency, and enhancing employee creativity and productivity.
